Be still and watchful ...

I have a "decorative plaque" at home upon which is inscribed a quote from Ralph Waldo Emerson: "Let us be silent that we may hear the whisper of God." It is one of my favorite quotes and came to mind immediately from my devotional reading for today, which has to do with "being still and watchful."

My current devotional writer, Marilyn McIntyre, is quite adamant that "wait" is an active verb. She says, "Faithful waiting is expectant, hopeful, focused, attentive, watchful." She builds on this concept by saying: "Waiting and watching train the mind and the senses and attune them to God's guiding presence." She goes on to talk about the "art of watching," noting that if you fix your gaze on one spot too long, you might miss something that is happening nearby that doesn't register with you. But, if you cast your gaze around too quickly from one spot to another, you might well miss something going on that takes more than a passing moment to be revealed. The trick, she says, is to learn to move your gaze slowly and intently.

It strikes me that this is a good metaphor for understanding the Christian walk of faith. Sometimes there is so much to do, so much to take in, that we flutter from one activity, one ministry to another without ever settling long enough to fully understand the discipline we are trying to learn or appreciate the full significance of the ministry in which we are participating. On the other hand, we can become so fixated, so intent, so committed to one tradition, one activity, one ministry of the church, that a whole world of possible experiences passes us by unnoticed. Either way, the result is that we are less than we can be.

As summer begins to wane and the promise of fall comes ever near, it makes me stop and wonder, "what have I missed" the last few months by not being attentive enough to all that is going on around me or by being too fixed on a few things. It is not an easy walk that we are called to as disciples of Jesus. It is not easy to be so silent and still, so as to hear the whisper of God, while at the same time meeting deadlines, planning activities, showing up to help and sharing life with our brothers and sisters in faith.

I guess that is why it is so important to understand why "grace" is needed to get us through.






